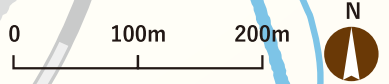

Yamaguchi Gion Festival

July 20-27

A traditional festival that has been held for about 600 years. The festival will be held on July 20-27 every year. Omikoshi (a portable shrine or a sacred palanquin) and all citizens' dance in which about 2,000 citizens will march will be held.

There will be street stalls, and it is a week that you can feel "Summer in Japan"!

Mr. Mod* wrote, "The better the people, the better the festivals."

On the first day, Sagi no Mai (heron dance) will be offered at Yasaka-jinja Shrine and after that, the mikoshi is moved to the Otabi-sho (a place where the deity rests or lodges during a festival). On the final day of the 27th, Gokanko to return the deity to Yasaka-jinja Shrine from Otabi-sho will be held.
