

Main Modes of Transportation to Yamaguchi city







Yasaka Shrine / Tatekoji / Central shopping district: 20th–27th Portable shrines are marched from Yasaka Shrine

through their otabisho (resting point). Sagi no Mai and dances are also performed. City center, Park Road, and Yuda Onsen: 6th-7th

Kozan Park: Mid-September Roughly 1,000 lit candles are placed along a walking path at Kozan Park-which is home to National treasure Rurikoji Temple's Five-Storied Pagoda—creating a mystical at Concerts and other events are also held.



Yuda Onsen: Mid-October Yamaguchi prides itself in its local sake. In this event, Yamaguchi's local brewers get together to provide visito with an opportunity to sample the best sake around and pair it with regional dishes made with fresh seafood from both the Sea of Japan and the Seto Inland Sea.

Nov Furukuma Shrine / Central shopping district: 23rd In this annual festival in honor of Tenjin the God of scholarship, a procession featuring costumed characters, reminiscent of the ones depicted in historical scrolls, departs from Yasaka Shrine and joins in the parade that leaves from Furukuma Shrine and carry the mikoshi with the delty throughout the city.

Yamaguchi city: 1st-31st Yamaguchi is believed to be the first place where X-mas was celebrated in Japan. The watchword is "Yamaguchi X-mas city" at locations throughout the city, with many X-mas -related events being held.
