*Yukata in summer (Jun.-Sep.) (3,000 yen per day)

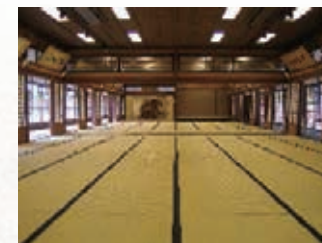

Yamaguchi City Saikoutei Information

Yamaguchi City Saikoutei is a facility that opened in October, 2004 as a sightseeing base in Yamaguchi with many historical artifacts, it is also a place for citizen exchange.

The building was originally a luxurious traditional Japanese restaurant named Gion Saikoutei which operated from around 1878 to 1996. It was later relocated and refurbished. It is a precious building which tells the history of Early Modern Period of Japan.

Many calligraphy writings are displayed here, including those written by celebrities and Prime ministers who held parties at the restaurant.

10 Yamaguchi Xavier Memorial Church

This memorial church was built in 1952 to commemorate the 400th anniversary of St. Francis Xavier's visit to Yamaguchi. (The current building was rebuilt in 1998.)



1 Yamaguchi City Saikoutei

Formerly a traditional Japanese restaurant, the building preserves the traditional Japanese atmosphere.



2 National treasure Rurikoji Temple's Five-Storeyed Pagoda

This five-storeyed pagoda, built during the medieval Muromachi period, is one of the three most famous pagodas in Japan. The after-dark lighting produces a subtle and profound effect.



3 Toshunji Temple

This is the family temple of Lord Motonari Mori and is located next to the Rurikoji Temple. The Gate and kannondo temple building are designated national important cultural properties.



4 Yamaguchi Prefectural Government Museum

Built during the Taisho Period, this building is a designated national important cultural property.




5 Hanchomon Gate

Built by Lord Takachika Mori during the Late Edo Period, this structure is a Yamaguchi Prefectural designated important cultural property.




6 Ichinosakagawa River

This is an excellent place for a stroll with the flowering cherry trees in spring and the Genji fireflies, a national protected species, flitting happily in early summer!



7 Yasakajinja Shrine

The red arches of this shrine are impressive and the main building, built during the Muromachi Period by Lord Yoshioki Ouchi, is a designated national important cultural property.



9 Yamaguchi Furusato Heritage Center

The site consists of the Manabi Building, Takumi Building, and Miyabi Building, and visitors can try their hand at making Ouchi Lacquer ware chopsticks (reservation required).



8 Ryufukuji Temple

The main building, with its restored cypress-bark roof, is a designated national important cultural property. The expansive traditional Japanese mini-landscape garden recreated on the same site is a must-see.
